ETC Situation Report #18

Mali Crisis

Reporting period 17/10/2012 to 28/11/12

Highlights:

- The ETC is assisting humanitarian organizations in Bamako and Mopti with reprogramming, purchasing and installing equipment.
- ICT services and user support to the humanitarian community continues to be provided in Mopti by WFP and NRC staff.
- Common VHF backup repeater was successfully installed in WFP Bamako, compound.

Cluster Responsibilities:

• WFP is leading ETC activities in Mali with responsibility for coordination, implementation and overall operation support for common ICT services.

Activities and Achievements:

- New frequencies were obtained from the government after the ETC assessment showed existing frequencies were compromised. The ETC has assisted humanitarian organizations with the reprogramming of 487 handsets 56 vehicle radios to date.
- The ETC continues to provide communications support in Mopti through the ETC response solution. User support is being provided by World Food Programme (WFP) and Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) staff. The ETC response solution consisting of technologies from emergency.lu, Ericsson Response and WFP provides data connectivity and voice telephony services at no cost to the humanitarian community on the ground.
 - The new user registration issues have now been solved.
- An inventory of new ETC equipment is almost finished. The inventory will include any equipment that has been installed, handed over or is required by the ETC.
 - The latest purchased equipment was cleared from customs and is now stored in WFP Bamako premises.

- Humanitarian organizations on the ground have requested ETC assistance with procuring and installing equipment.
 - The ETC is helping with equipment installation in Mopti and Bamako.
 - Procurement support is being provided by Global Humanitarian Services (GHS) in WFP Dubai.
- A common contingency plan has been circulated. The ETC section was submitted for inclusion.
- Ozdzan Hadziemin from WFP FITTEST is the current ETC coordinator. He will depart Mali at the end of November. He will be temporarily replaced by Nyanaprakash Muniandy, also from WFP FITTEST.

Challenges and Gaps:

- Five new radio operators have been selected and trained and examined to work in the COMCEN in Mopti. The ETC is waiting for UNDP to sign their contracts so they can be deployed. It has been three months since they were first recruited.
- An MOU has been drafted between WFP and UNDP to define the terms of payment for radio operators (until end of 2012) and other expenses incurred by the ETC. The MOU is awaiting final signature.
- The tense security situation remains an ongoing challenge for humanitarian operations across Mali. Security in Bamako is relatively calm, however the north of the country remains a no-travel area for UN personnel.
- There were problems with the main generator in the UNICEF/WFP compound in Mopti. An ETC backup generator is currently being used which has enabled the continuous provision of data services while the faulty generator is being repaired. A new generator will be shipped to Mopti from the WFP warehouse in Bamako pending receipt of a quote from a local shipping company.
- There is a possibility that there will be a shortage in ETC staff in December. Replacements for current staff need to be identified.

Planned Activities:

- There are indications that a military intervention in the north of Mali will begin in March, however nothing has been confirmed. In anticipation of military intervention in the north, ETC plans for 2013 will take into account the situation in neighbouring countries as refugees may flee any fighting.
 - If military intervention in the north results in a deterioration of the security situation in Mopti then Segou or San will be used as backup locations.
 - Equipment has already been purchased for potential deployment to these locations. It has not been decided which of these two locations will be used, but it is likely to be San due to its large runway and proximity to



Mopti. There are also hotels with sufficient security. Organizations are working on a common contingency plan.

- There is a possibility that the UNICEF/WFP office in Mopti will be relocated to smaller premises, though nothing has yet been confirmed. The ETC will support the relocation.
- The ETC will liaise with OCHA to ensure that ETC operations are covered on their dashboard documents in the future.

Meetings:

The Global ETC teleconferences for Mali will now be held on an as-needed basis. Regular updates will continue to be shared on the ICT HEP website.
