Republic of South Sudan

Situation Report #7

Reporting period 23/03/12 to 05/04/12

**Summary:**

- Cross border attacks broke out along the restive border between Sudan and South Sudan putting thousands of civilians at risk. A convoy with up to 1,700 South Sudanese returnees was caught up in the border conflict in Southern Kordofan. Half of the convoy headed to Renk, where the ETC has an installation, while the rest are reported to be heading north.
- The influx of refugees from Sudan into South Sudan continues with 2,000 new arrivals in Upper Nile in the past week. The possibility of a mass return movement from Sudan in the near future cannot be ruled out.

**Cluster Responsibilities:**

- WFP is leading ETC activities in South Sudan with responsibility for coordination, implementation and overall operation support for common ICT services.

**Achievements:**

- The ETC has completed delivery of 95 free radio training sessions to the humanitarian community in South Sudan. A total of 426 people, from 9 UN agencies and 108 NGOs, across 8 locations participated in the training. This training improves the standard of radio protocol, for security and safety of staff in the field.
  - 12 of the participants completed the Training-of-Trainers course which establishes a pool of qualified instructors to transfer knowledge within South Sudan.
- The ETC response solution, composed of the emergency.lu and Ericsson Response WIDER systems, continues to provide free internet connectivity and voice telephony services in Bentiu (Unity state), Maban (Upper Nile state), Pibor (Jonglei state) and Renk (Upper Nile state).
- The number of users of the ETC response solution is still increasing with a total of 1205 people from 135 different organizations having been registered to use the ETC services.
- A VHF repeater has been installed by the ETC in the UNMISS compound in Pibor. This new repeater will expand the range of radio coverage in the Pibor area. For assistance with radio programming, send a request to: [SouthSudan.ETC@wfp.org](mailto:SouthSudan.ETC@wfp.org)

## Challenges and Gaps:

- The HISP (Humanitarian Internet Service Provider) project has not yet begun due to funding issues. An assessment and project proposal have been completed however it remains underfunded.
  - The ETC response solution installations, in all the four locations, are temporary only. The HISP project will provide reliable long-term services at lower running costs.

## Planned Activities:

- Dismantling of the Bentiu GATR balloon from the Government of Luxembourg will start on April 15. Contact has been made with EMC to have a separate inter-agency LAN for Bentiu ETC operations.
