# Summary:

- An IASC System-Wide Emergency was activated on 15/01/13. Humanitarian organizations are scaling up operations in response to the evolving crisis. Only the ETC and Logistics Cluster have been activated in Syria to date.
- The ETC is attempting to provide common telecommunications services within Syria, however lack of access and restrictions on movement have complicated these efforts and have led to a number of missions being cancelled.

# **Cluster Responsibilities:**

- The ETC in Syria is providing emergency telecommunications support to humanitarian organizations on the ground including VHF/HF radio programming and installation.
- Responsibility for the provision of ETC/Common ICT services across the region is shared between WFP (Syria, Turkey and Iraq) and UNHCR (Lebanon and Jordan).
  - WFP is providing support to UNHCR telecommunications service provision if and when required.
  - $_{\odot}$   $\,$  WFP coordinates regional activities in close collaboration with UNHCR and other partners.

# Achievements:

SYRIA

• The WFP VSAT is now operational in the Four Seasons hotel providing up to 2MB of bandwidth. Discussions are ongoing about sharing common data connectivity services to the humanitarian community.

# JORDAN

- Ekue Ayih (EA) has replaced Ivan Thomas as ETC Coordinator in Amman and will be deployed to Damascus as soon as possible. The initial duration of EA's mission is three months.
- A radio room was established in Zaatari refugee camp with support from UNDSS. However, the COMCEN is not yet fully operational due to staffing issues.
- Prepositioning of ETC equipment in Beirut and Dubai is being coordinated from

# Amman.

• Prepositioning has been completed, however a few items are still pending from suppliers.

# LEBANON

- New warehouses have been identified for the storage of ICT and ETC equipment.
- The final batch of ICT equipment has been cleared from customs as part of the ETC's upgrade of the security telecommunications network in northeast Lebanon.
- EMC equipment that will increase the bandwidth of the VSAT in Damascus has been delivered to Beirut. It will be imported into Syria has approval has been granted.

# TURKEY

- In Turkey, an assessment mission was deployed to Gaziantep to identify new premises for a proposed COMCEN.
- The ETC is assisting UNDSS with a bulk SMS solution for the humanitarian community in Hatay.

# Challenges and Gaps:

- The volatile security situation remains a challenge to deployment in the field.
- Licensing and importation of telecommunications equipment into Damascus remains a challenge.
- Obtaining customs clearance from Lebanese authorities for ETC equipment en route to Syria is challenging.

# **Planned Activities:**

- In Syria, contingency plans are being made for emergency internet provision should the local ISP in Damascus go down.
- Continued cooperation with UNCHR to ensure the COMCEN in Zaatari refugee camp is fully operational.
- Complete mission report for the Gaziantep COMCEN and enlist necessary support.
- Finalize equipment deliveries to Lebanon as part of the upgrade of the security telecommunications network and officially handover to UNDSS.
- Delivery of the EMC VSAT equipment to Damascus.
