



Emergency telecommunications services for the humanitarian community

ETC Situation Report #09

Syria Crisis

Reporting period 22/08/2013 to 22/09/2013

Summary:

- An IASC System-Wide Emergency was activated on 15/01/13. Humanitarian organizations are scaling up operations in response to the evolving crisis. Only the ETC and Logistics Cluster have been activated in Syria to date.
- The ETC is attempting to provide common telecommunications services within Syria, however lack of access and restrictions on movement have complicated these efforts and have led to a number of missions being cancelled.

Cluster Responsibilities:

- The ETC in Syria is providing emergency telecommunications support to humanitarian organizations on the ground including VHF/HF radio programming and installation.
- Responsibility for the provision of ETC/Common ICT services across the region is shared between WFP (Syria, Turkey and Iraq) and UNHCR (Lebanon and Jordan).
 - WFP is providing support to UNHCR telecommunications service provision if and when required.
 - WFP coordinates regional activities in close collaboration with UNHCR and other partners.

Achievements:

SYRIA

- The ETC is now providing shared data connectivity services in the Four Seasons hotel in Damascus, with up to 512 kbps available.
 - In order to get a dedicated link, organizations must submit a request to <u>Syria.ETC@wfp.org</u>. They can then establish a contract with EMC directly.
- A mission was deployed to Homs to assess ICT requirements at the UN hub.

JORDAN

- At the Zaatari refugee camp, a VHF network and repeater is in place, the radio room is operational and the frequency plan has been upgraded.
- Data and security telecommunications services are being installed at Azraq refugee camp. These will be managed by UNHCR.

An ETC Working Group meeting was held on 15/09/13.

LEBANON

 An inventory check of equipment is being completed to ensure it is ready to be deployed to Syria as soon as approvals have been received.

UAE

• Equipment has been prepositioned in Dubai and is being checked and labelled in preparation for potential deployment to Syria. Deployment is dependent on need and approval.

Challenges and Gaps:

SYRIA

- The volatile security situation remains a challenge to deployment in the field.
- Licensing and importation of telecommunications equipment into Damascus remains a challenge.

Planned Activities:

SYRIA

- There are plans to establish an inter-agency office in Tartus, however nothing has been confirmed.
- There are plans to deploy an IT mission to Homs to establish LAN infrastructure and improve the VHF network.

JORDAN

- There are plans to upgrade the radio room at Zaatari refugee camp in the near future by installing an additional VHF base radio.
- The Azraq refugee camp is due to open soon. VHF radios and ICT equipment are awaiting customs clearance. They will then be shipped to the camp.
 - A VHF repeater will be deployed and a COMCEN established within the next couple of weeks.

TURKEY

 A COMCEN in Gaziantep will be established in the WFP office, however approval from the Turkish authorities regarding the new location of the office is required before work can begin.
