

Emergency telecommunications services for the humanitarian community

ETC Situation Report #10

Syria Crisis

Reporting period 22/09/2013 to 10/11/2013

Summary:

- An IASC System-Wide Emergency was activated on 15/01/13. Only the ETC and Logistics Cluster have been activated in Syria to date.
- The ETC is attempting to provide common telecommunications services within Syria, however lack of access and restrictions on movement have complicated these efforts and have led to a number of missions being cancelled.

Cluster Responsibilities:

- The ETC in Syria is providing emergency telecommunications support to humanitarian organizations on the ground including VHF/HF radio programming and installation.
- Responsibility for the provision of ETC/Common ICT services across the region is shared between WFP (Syria, Turkey and Iraq) and UNHCR (Lebanon and Jordan).
 - WFP is providing support to UNHCR telecommunications service provision if and when required.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ WFP coordinates regional activities in close collaboration with UNHCR and other partners.

Achievements:

SYRIA

- The ETC continues to provide data connectivity services in the Four Seasons hotel in Damascus, with up to 2 Mbps available.
 - IOM, UNDP, OCHA and UNICEF have each requested a dedicated internet link. Bandwidth will be limited to 512 kbps per agency.
 - Due to limited capacity, no further requests for dedicated internet links will be considered at this stage.
- The ETC has deployed basic communications services at the UN common hub in Homs.
 - This includes internet, printing and LAN infrastructure.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ VHF coverage in Homs is also being expanded.

JORDAN

- At the Join Operations Centre (JOC) in Zaatari refugee camp a VHF base station has been deployed and the power system has been upgraded through the connection of a solar pack in the radio room.
- At Al Azraq refugee camp a microwave link has been deployed and will be distributed to the prefabs.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ A VHF repeater and radio base station have also been deployed.
- The importation of 300 handheld radios ordered by UNHCR for use in Zaatari and Azraq refugee camps has been approved.
- Regular ETC Working Group meetings are being held.
- The Budget Revision (BR) for various projects, including the Syria REC, Syria EMOP, and Jordan EMOP, is currently being approved.
 - The ETC BR was approved last week.
- Sylvain Tiako, FITTEST ICT Specialist, has replaced Ekue Ayih as ETC Coordinator in Amman.

LEBANON

• The VHF upgrade project in the north of the country has now been officially handed over to UNDSS.

Challenges and Gaps:

SYRIA

- The volatile security situation remains a challenge to deployment in the field.
- Licensing and importation of telecommunications equipment into Damascus remains a challenge.

Planned Activities:

SYRIA

- WFP will lead the establishment of a UN hub in Tartus. A plan is currently being developed by the Logistics Cluster.
 - The ETC is contributing to the development of this plan to ensure that its requirements are included.
 - $_{\odot}$ The UN hub is expected to be operational by the end of 2013.

JORDAN

• Between 15 and 20 additional staff are expected to join the REC team in Jordan over the next few months.
