

Central African Republic ETC Situation Report #2 Reporting period 21/12/13

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Highlights

- Over the past weeks, there has been an intensification of violence and a shift to a more sectarian and communal conflict in greater Bangui and other major towns, such as Bossangoa. This culminated on 05 December with coordinated attacks of anti-Balaka elements in Bangui and Bossangoa. As of 10 December, the situation in Bangui remains volatile, characterized by sudden but brief outbursts of sectarian violence between ex-Seleka and anti-Balaka fighters. The situation has disrupted humanitarian activities and increased humanitarian assistance needs.
- On 11/12/2013, the IASC principals declared the humanitarian crisis in the Central African Republic a Level-3 emergency and activated system-wide L3 response for three months.

Cluster Responsibilities

• WFP is leading the ETC is CAR. The ETC is responsible for providing emergency telecommunications support to humanitarian organizations on the ground.

Achievements

- An ETC Coordinator and Information Management Officer were deployed to Bangui on 17/12/2013 in support of the local inter-agency ICT team.
- An ICT specialist was deployed on 14/12/2013 to Douala to support the arrival of equipment and shipment to Bangui.
- 7 Tons of ETC equipment including radio communications items, VSAT and power supply, was shipped on 16/12/2013.
- The ETC team met with the local ETC working group members on 18/12/2013. All confirmed requirements identified in the 2013 and 2014 ETC projects remain unchanged.
- Data connectivity continues to be provided at the WFP office in Bouar, OCHA office in Paoua, UNICEF office in Bossangoa and UNHCR office in Zemio.



Challenges and Gaps

- Critical security communications is required in the field. COMCENs are not operating 24/7 except in Bangui due to lack of Radio Operators.
- Transportation and customs clearance of equipment are taking time which is challenging the deployment plan.
- The security situation remains incredibly volatile and is delaying deployment in the seven planned locations.
- The ETC is only 35% funded which is only enough for deployment to four locations.

Planned Activities

- The ETC plans to support the establishment of common ICT services in seven field locations and the capital as follow:
 - Deployment of fully operational COMCENs and data connectivity in Bambari, Kaga Bandoro and Bossangoa as part of phase 1.
 - Deployment of fully operational COMCENs and data connectivity in Zemio, Ndele, Paoua, and Bouar as part of phase 2.
 - Enhance security telecommunications in Bangui.
