Highlights

- An MOU is being drafted between the ETC, WFP, UNDSS and UNDP to address the establishment of COMCENs and delivery of radio services within Syria. This should improve delivery of radio services and the safety and security of humanitarian staff on the ground.
- Radio coverage maps are being developed for Syria, Jordan and Lebanon so humanitarian organizations have a better idea of where radio services are being provided.

Cluster Responsibilities

- The ETC in Syria is providing emergency telecommunications support to humanitarian organizations on the ground including VHF/HF radio programming and installation.
- Responsibility for the provision of ETC/Common ICT services across the region is shared between WFP (Syria, Turkey and Iraq) and UNHCR (Lebanon and Jordan).
 - WFP is providing support to UNHCR telecommunications service provision if and when required.
 - WFP coordinates regional activities in close collaboration with UNHCR and other partners.

Achievements

- An MOU is being drafted between the ETC, WFP, UNDSS and UNDP to address the establishment of COMCENs and delivery of radio services within Syria. This should improve delivery of radio services and the safety and security of humanitarian staff on the ground.
 - \circ The MOU draft is currently under review by UNDP and WFP legal representatives.
- The standardisation of radio programming and communications in Syria, Jordan and Lebanon will also help improve the efficiency and effectiveness of radio communications.
- Radio coverage maps are being developed for Syria, Jordan and Lebanon so humanitarian organizations have a better idea of where radio services are being provided.
- Radio programming for the humanitarian community in Syria is ongoing.

Challenges and Gaps

- The importation and licensing of equipment remains a problem.
- The volatile security situation continues to delay the assessment and installation of telecommunications capability for the humanitarian community in key areas within Syria.

Planned Activities

- A radio trainer is due to arrive in Syria at the end of April (subject to visa approval) and will provide radio operator and radio user training.
- Three ETC assistants are being recruited for the offices in Homs, Tartus and Damascus and will assist in the establishment of the COMCENs.
- Radio operators are being recruited to fill vacant positions in COMCENs in Syria.
- Radio operator and user training will be provided in Syria in April and May.
