ETC Situation Report #16

Highlights

- An inter-agency radio working group has been established to review radio coverage in Amman, refresh call-sign allocations for Jordan and discuss other issues related to the provision of radio services in the country.
- An inter-agency radio room will be established in Domiz refugee camp in Dohuk, northern Iraq. Radio coverage will also be expanded in the area.
- An inter-agency committee is being formed to liaise with Syrian government authorities on licensing and importation of telecommunications equipment into the country.

Cluster Responsibilities

- The ETC in Syria is providing emergency telecommunications support to humanitarian organizations in operational areas within Syria and surrounding countries.
- Responsibility for the provision of ETC services (voice, internet, radio network and other services) across the region is shared between WFP and UNHCR.
 - WFP is providing support to other UN agencies for common service provision as required.
 - WFP coordinates regional activities in collaboration with partners.

Achievements

- Input has been provided to the SHARP 2014 mid-year review.

SYRIA

- Radio programming for the humanitarian community is ongoing.
 - A technical agreement between the ETC, UNDP and UNDSS is being prepared which governs the delivery of common radio services in Syria.
 - The agreement will improve the delivery of radio services and, consequently, the safety and security of humanitarian staff in operational areas.

JORDAN

- A mission was deployed to Amman to assess radio coverage. A recommendation will be prepared based on the findings of the mission.
- An inter-agency radio working group has been established to review radio coverage in Amman, refresh call-sign allocations for Jordan and discuss other issues related to the provision of radio services in the country.

IRAQ

- Radio programming is ongoing with the assistance of UNAMI.

Challenges and Gaps

- The importation and licensing of equipment remains a problem in Syria.
- The volatile security situation impacts the assessment and installation of telecommunications capability for the humanitarian community in key areas within Syria.

Planned Activities

SYRIA

- An inter-agency committee is being formed to liaise with Syrian government authorities on licensing and importation of telecommunications equipment.
- A radio trainer will be deployed to Syria to deliver sessions on the use of radio equipment to humanitarian workers and radio operators.
- The ETC will provide radio, voice and internet services for the humanitarian community at a planned UN hub in Tartous.

IRAQ

- A mission will be deployed in July to establish an inter-agency radio room in Domiz refugee camp in Dohuk, northern Iraq. Radio coverage will also be expanded in the area.
 - This will improve coordination and security of humanitarian organizations on the ground.

LEBANON

- A UNDSS mission will be deployed to provide maintenance on the radio repeater network in the north of Lebanon.
- Radio coverage in the north west of the country will be expanded with the installation of an antenna in Tripoli.
- UNIFIL are activating a digital radio network to replace the analogue radio network south of the Litani river in Lebanon. The digital network will provide more functionality than the analogue one.

- UNDSS will continue to operate the analogue radio network north of the Litani river.
 - A new permanent storage site in Beirut will be identified to store IT and telecommunications equipment pre-positioned for deployment.
