

Republic of South Sudan (RoSS) ETC Situation Report #53 Reporting period 30/06/14 to 13/07/14

ETC RoSS Sitreps are distributed every two weeks. The next report will be issued on or around 28/07/14.

Highlights

• Shared internet connectivity services are being provided to the humanitarian community from nine ETC hubs and six partner sites across South Sudan. A tenth site will be operational in the coming week.

Achievements

- A technician was deployed to Bentiu, Unity to replace faulty hardware which was causing some issues with internet connectivity.
- A technician has been deployed to Bentiu to assess the area and to prepare for installation of the ETC Response Solution, with technologies from emergency.lu, Ericsson Response and WFP, in the coming week.
- The ETC continues to programme radios for the humanitarian community in

South Sudan and allocate call signs. In the first half of 2014, the ETC programmed 474 radios for 55 different humanitarian organisations. Radio communications is vital for security and coordination of humanitarian activities, especially in remote areas.

Challenges and Gaps

• Procurement of telecommunications equipment continues to be challenging as lengthy import procedures and the volatile security situation frequently cause significant delays.

• An increase in number of humanitarian workers responding to the needs of some 40,500 internally displaced people hosted in the Protection of Civilians (PoC) site in the UNMISS base in Bentiu, is straining the ETC internet connectivity networks currently in place.

Planned Activities

- Following the established of Digital Mobile Radio (DMR) as the ETC standard for Digital Radio, an assessment is being carried out across the country to determine the most suitable migration path for South Sudan. Digital radio technology has a number of beneficial features including GPS tracking, private calls, group calls, SMS alerting and broadcasting between sites.
- At the request of the humanitarian community, the ETC will establish internet connectivity services in Yida, Unity state, where there are more than 70,500 refugees hosted in the UNHCR camp. Services will be provided to humanitarians from the UNHCR compound.
- ETC Response Solution equipment will be sent to Bentiu to expand internet connectivity services to meet the demands of the growing humanitarian population there.
- The ETC plans to conduct assessments in Melut and Wau Shiluk, Upper Nile state; and Nyal and Leer, Unity state to understand connectivity needs of humanitarians operating at these locations.

Funding

The total funding required by ETC South Sudan to carry out operations until the end of 2014 is US\$4,488,934. As of 15/07/14 the project was 38.7% funded.

ETC South Sudan is grateful for funding support from Common Humanitarian Fund (CHF), Government of Luxembourg and AusAid.

- Local ETC meetings are held every two weeks. The next meeting will be held on 17/07/14.
- Global ETC teleconferences are held every two weeks. The next teleconference will be held on 21/07/14.

Background on the crisis:

Conflict broke out in Juba, the capital of South Sudan, on 15 December 2013 and quickly spread to several other states. Within weeks, thousands of people had been killed or wounded in the violence, and hundreds of thousands displaced from their homes. The crisis has led to a serious deterioration in the food security situation, and some 3.9 million people will face alarming levels of food insecurity by August 2014.

The Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) was activated in South Sudan in 2011, following the country's independence, to provide security and data telecommunications and coordination services to the humanitarian community. Since the recent conflict began, the ETC scaled up its activities and expanded to new locations in the interior of South Sudan, supporting humanitarian organizations involved in the crisis response through the provision of vital telecommunication services.
