

**Republic of South Sudan (RoSS)**  
**ETC Situation Report #55**  
**Reporting period 28/07/14 to 10/08/14**

ETC RoSS Sitreps are distributed every two weeks. The next report will be issued on or around 25/08/14.

### Highlights

- The ETC is now providing internet connectivity to the humanitarian community in Yida.
- The Global Cluster Coordinators meeting has been held in Juba, 03-08/08/14.

### Achievements

- The ETC is now providing shared internet connectivity services to the humanitarian community in Yida from the UNHCR compound using a K-band VSAT.
- In Bentiu, Unity State, an ETC Customer Support Services assistant was deployed to provide onsite ICT support to humanitarian workers during the last three weeks. Approximately 183 humanitarian workers are currently using ETC services however this number is expected to increase. Additional ETC equipment has been installed to increase the system capacity.
- In Mingkaman, Lakes State, ETC partners raised connectivity issues last Thursday. A technician was deployed the same day and the services were restored using a temporary solution. Four hundred and thirty humanitarians have now registered to use ETC services onsite.
- The ETC relocated the VSATs from the UNMISS base in Bor, Jonglei State to the new humanitarian hub, where most humanitarian organisations are moving. Connectivity services are currently being utilised by more than 60 users.
- The Global Cluster Coordinators meeting was held in Juba, from 03-08/08/14; Martin Kristensson (Global ETC Coordinator) represented the ETC. The purpose of the

meeting was to enhance coordination both on global and local levels, taking into consideration that the emergency in country is getting worse.

- A technician intervened at the UN House, Juba 3, to reconfigure the system which was causing Wi-Fi connectivity issues.
- The ETC continues to programme radios for the humanitarian community in South Sudan and allocate call signs. In the past two weeks, the ETC programmed 42 radios. Radio communications are vital for security and coordination, especially in remote areas.

## Challenges and Gaps

- In Mingkaman, the user registration system is not working properly, a technician will be deployed to address the problem.
- Procurement of telecommunications equipment continues to be challenging as lengthy import procedures and the volatile security situation frequently cause significant delays.

## Planned Activities

- In the coming weeks, a user feedback survey will be released to assess ETC performance and satisfaction with ETC services.
- The ETC Response Solution, with technologies from emergency.lu, Ericsson Response and WFP, will be installed in Bentiu during the coming weeks to expand internet connectivity services and meet the demands of the growing humanitarian population there. Ground works have begun.

### Background on the crisis:

Conflict broke out in Juba, the capital of South Sudan, on 15 December 2013 and quickly spread to several other states. Within weeks, thousands of people had been killed or wounded in the violence, and hundreds of thousands displaced from their homes. The crisis has led to a serious deterioration in the food security situation, and some 3.9 million people will face alarming levels of food insecurity by August 2014.

The Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) was activated in South Sudan in 2011, following the country's independence, to provide security and data telecommunications and coordination services to the humanitarian community. Since the recent conflict began, the ETC scaled up its activities and expanded to new locations in the interior of South Sudan, supporting humanitarian organizations involved in the crisis response through the provision of vital telecommunication services.
