

**Republic of South Sudan**  
**ETC Situation Report #61**  
**Reporting period 20/10/14 to 03/11/14**

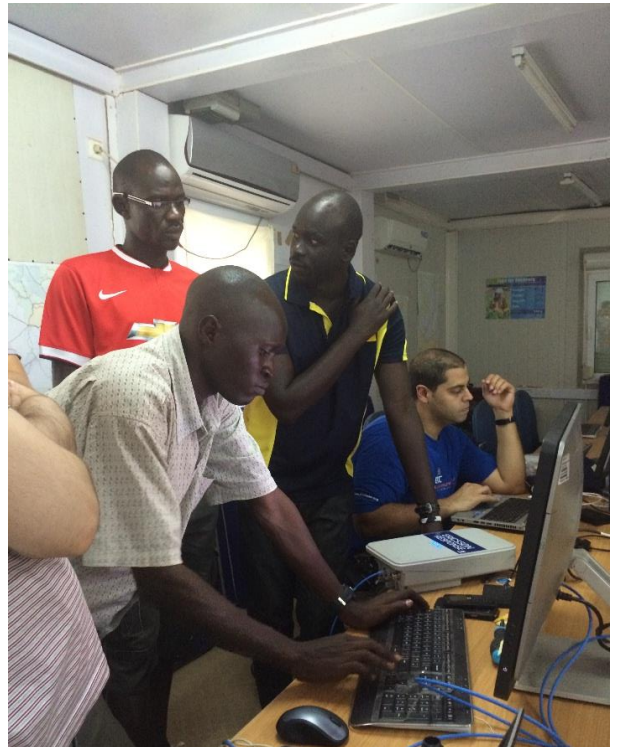
ETC RoSS Sitreps are distributed every two weeks. The next report will be issued on or around 18/11/14.

### Highlights

- The Emergency Telecommunications Cluster in South Sudan finalized its Cluster Response Planning for 2015. The cluster response plan and corresponding Project were drafted. Once reviewed by the HC office they will be incorporated in the overall SRP for South Sudan.
- A mission from Ericsson Response was in Juba for two weeks. They provided training to 5 staff on WIDER4 as well as Let's Net basics. They reviewed both Mingkaman and Bentiu sites and installed additional Access points in Mingkaman.

### Achievements

- A new survey was circulated to the IT Staff of the Humanitarian community. The survey aims at reviewing the requirements for the current services ETC provides in 2014. Results of the survey will help finalize ETC plans for 2015.
- *Bentiu, Unity State:* Due to the security situation a mission to Bentiu to increase the internet coverage provided by the emergency.lu response kit and install additional Access Points was postponed till security situation is stable.
- *Mingakaman Jonglei State:* A mission from Ericsson Response visited Mingkaman where one of the ETC Response solutions composed of technologies from emergency.lu, Ericsson Response and WFP is installed. They assessed OXFAM hub new locations as they requested access to ETC services. Services can be provided after relocation of the current Humanitarian hub.

- *Juba, Central Equatoria State:* The bandwidth of C-band VSAT in Tomping was decreased effective 1st November. It is kept as a backup till end of 2014 where it will be reallocated to another location.
- ETC visited the UN house green solar solutions powering the UNIMISS Radio network in Juba.
- The ETC provides radio programming services to UN Agencies and NGOs. 988 radios have been programmed in 2014 for 61 humanitarian organizations. Over the past 2 weeks 58 radios were programmed.

### Challenges and Gaps

- Funding for ETC activity for 2014 was exhausted and mobilization of additional funds is ongoing.
- Procurement of telecommunications equipment continues to be challenging as lengthy import procedures and the volatile security situation frequently cause significant delays.

### Planned Activities

- The ETC plans to join in the assessments for proposed Operating Centers. The assessments are organized by OCHA.

### Meetings

- Local ETC meetings are held every two weeks. The next meeting will be held on **06/11/14**.

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### Background on the crisis:

Conflict broke out in Juba, the capital of South Sudan, on 15 December 2013 and quickly spread to several other states. Within weeks, thousands of people had been killed or wounded in the violence, and hundreds of thousands displaced from their homes. The crisis has led to a serious deterioration in the food security situation, and some 3.9 million people will face alarming levels of food insecurity by August 2014.

The Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) was activated in South Sudan in 2011, following the country's independence, to provide security and data telecommunications and coordination services to the humanitarian community. Since the recent conflict began, the ETC scaled up its activities and expanded to new locations in the interior of South Sudan, supporting humanitarian organizations involved in the crisis response through the provision of vital telecommunication services.
