1. IRAQ

Security situation

Nothing significant to report.



ETC Response

- The Humanitarian Needs Overview (HNO) 2019 for Iraq has been finalized and distributed to relevant parties.
- The ETC is planning to demobilize Internet connectivity services in all camps by 31 December 2018 as local ISPs are now up and running and therefore ETC services are no longer required.

2. Libya

Security situation

ETS Response

- The ETS was activated in Libya in October to provide emergency telecommunications services to humanitarians in hubs in Tripoli which is operational and in Benghazi and Sebha which are not yet operational.
- The ETS received US\$550,000 from CERF funds establish services in the new hub in Benghazi.
- In the HRP Libya 2019, ETS activities include the provision of Internet connectivity services, ICT helpdesk, facilitate emergency communications systems that are MOSS-compliant. The ETS budget for 2019 is US\$2.4 million.
- The ETS team are exploring options to implement Services for Communities (S4C) projects. The ETC S4C Adviser conducted a mission to Tunis to explore ways to implement a complaint feedback mechanism, such as a call centre. The concept note has been shared with OCHA.
- Access constraints are a challenge in some places as is the visa process for international staff and importing telecommunications equipment into the country. Therefore, the ETS is procuring equipment through local providers.

3. SYRIA AND SURROUNDING COUNTRIES

Security situation

• The security situation in Idlib, Aleppo and Deir Ez-Zour is still volatile. Permission to conduct ETC assessments in those areas was denied.

ETC Response

- Following the ban on the use of Motorola radios in Syria, the ETC will use Ikon radios using the UNHCR Long-term Agreement (LTA).
- In 2019, the UN plans to establish a presence in four additional locations in Syria: Deir Ezzour, Deraa, Hama and Raqqa. The ETC will conduct assessments ahead of providing Internet connectivity in 2019.
- Existing ETC services in 5x locations will continue next year.



One capacity building exercise is planned in 2019 and will be delivered to government partners.

Whole of Syria Business as usual

Turkey

Following the assessment to the UN hub in Gazientep, ETC services are not required as UN agencies at the
hub are using their own capacity. In 2019, the ETC might scale down services in this hub but will continue
to provide support to cross-border operations to Syria from Qamishli and Reyhanli.

4. YEMEN

Security situation

- In a significant step, a ceasefire was agreed for Al Hudaydah on 13 December which will come into effect on 18 December.
- Under the terms of the ceasefire, management of Al Hudaydah port will be handed over to the UN.

ETC Response

• The ETC is preparing to support the planned scale up and has prepared a budget covering the procurement of additional equipment, deployment of staff and provision of all services to up to 100x humanitarians that are expected to enter Al Hudaydah initially.
