ETC Situation Report #46

Reporting period 18/09/2017 to 09/11/2017

These Situation Reports are distributed monthly approximately. The next report will be issued on or around 30/11/17.

Highlights

- The Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) team has completed a tower installation in Haj Ali, expanding provision of Internet connectivity and security telecommunications services in Haj Ali and Jeddah camps.
- The Arbat camp has been identified as the next location to be provided Services for Communities (S4C). Deployment of an S4C Advisor will take place within the coming months.
- Increasing security concerns have compelled the ETC team to cancel 3x missions to Qayyarah, Haji Ali and As Salamiyah.

Situation Overview

The Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) has been activated in Iraq since 2014 after heavy fighting erupted between the Iraqi Security Forces (ISF) and the armed opposition groups. As a result, an estimated eleven million people across Iraq are in need of life-saving assistance.

The country has remained extremely volatile with telecommunications infrastructure having been severely damaged by the conflict while provision and restoration of communications services are required to support the response community.

As the global lead of the ETC, the World Food Programme (WFP) is convening the ETC in Iraq to meet vital communications needs, responding with government, the private sector and humanitarian organizations to ensure a coordinated response.



Response

- The ETC has completed a telecommunications assessment mission to Hasansham and has identified the location with a suitable tower that will be used to set up security telecommunications and Internet connectivity.
- The ETC team has completed a tower installation in Haj Ali expanding provision of Internet connectivity and security telecommunications services in Haj Ali and Jeddah camps
- The ETC completed a mission to a Non-Government Organisation (NGO) Mercy Hands to demobilize ETC equipment and transfer it to IOM camp in Haj Ali.
- The ETC is in contact with UN Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI) to expand telecommunications network by using the already available UNAMI infrastructure. With this expansion, staff using handheld radios will be able to reach Erbil radio room from Qayyarah.
- The ETC has conducted 2x radio training for 32 humanitarian staff from the UN High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR).
- 18x radios were programmed for the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) and World Food Programme (WFP) partners in Erbil.

Services for Communities (S4C)

- The ETC has identified Arbat as the next location to be provided with common ICT services to affected communities.
- The ETC is in the midst of identifying an S4C advisor and is planning for the deployment to take place within the coming months.

Planned Response

- Due to the fluid security situation, the ETC team continues to assess possibilities of providing Internet connectivity and security telecommunications services to the humanitarian community in Al Qayyarah (Qayyarah Jad'ah 3-6,) Hassan Sham (Hassan Sham M2, Hassan Sham U2, Hassan Sham U3), Khazer M1, As Salamiyah, Hammam Al Alil 1 and 2, and Nargizliya,
- The ETC is requesting government permission to enter a new site identified to connect ETC repeaters to the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI) network to increase radio coverage for both UNAMI and United Nations (UN) personnel.
 - o Analogue radio repeaters will be installed in Hassan Sham and As Salaminyah to provide Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) with security telecommunications services.



Challenges

- The ETC team was compelled to cancel 3x missions to Qayyarah, Haji Ali and As Salamiyah due to rising security concerns.
- Another mission to Haji Ali ended abruptly during its deployment due to security instability.
- Plans for future field missions are hampered due to the volatile security situation.

Meetings

- The next Global ETC Joint teleconference will take place on 29 November.
- The next Local ETC Working Group meeting will take place on 23 November.
