# ETC Situation Report #50 Reporting period 19/02/2018 to 27/03/2018

# **Highlights**

- The Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC) Services for Communities (S4C) Advisor completed a mission to Iraq to determine what S4C activities may be implemented.
- To ensure the safety and security of responders and to ensure that security telecommunications services are used correctly, the ETC assisted the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) and UN Population Fund (UNFPA) with radio programming activities.

### **Situation Overview**

Heavy rains and flooding in the second half of February affected around 33 camps and sites and 200,000 displaced people, predominantly in northern and central governorates. From mid-January 2018 until the end of February, the Camp Coordination and Camp Management Cluster has reported the arrival of 23,208 displaced people in camps in Ninewa governorate.

In a joint announcement, published on 6 March, the Government of Iraq, the United Nations and its partners launched their 2018 humanitarian plans for Iraq: the Government's Plan for Relief, Shelter and Stabilization of Displaced People and the Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP). The humanitarian community is appealing for US\$ 569 million through the HRP to respond to the needs of the 3.4 million most vulnerable people in Iraq. This year, approximately 8.7 million people, nearly half of them children, will require some form of humanitarian assistance while as many as two million displaced Iraqis are expected to return.

The ETC is a global network of organizations that work together to provide shared communications services in humanitarian emergencies.



#### Response

- The ETC deployed Internet connectivity services for humanitarians in As Salamiyah camp, covering Hammam al Ali camps 1 and 2 as part of the Mosul response.
- The ETC carried out assessment and monitoring missions on ETC Internet connectivity services provided through a local Internet Service Provider (ISP) in Hassan Sham, Haj Ali, Qayyarah, Jad'ah camps 1 to 6 and Jad'ah airstrip.
- The transfer of the ETC Communications Centres (COMCEN) operations in Erbil, Dohuk and Sulaymaniyah to UN Department of Safety and Security (UNDSS) is ongoing.
- The ETC has appealed for US\$1.9 million in 2018 to ensure humanitarians in Iraq have access to reliable Internet connectivity and security telecommunications services to enable their response. Although no new funds have been received, the ETC has US\$1.2 million in carry over from last year.
- To ensure the provision of vital communications services in the long term, the ETC is shortlisting candidates for two positions: 1x Information Technology (IT) assistant and 1x Information Management associate.

# **Services for Communities (S4C)**

- The ETC continues to run its S4C project in Domiz camp, Dohuk and supports (WFP)'s Tech for Food project in Arbat camp by providing Internet connectivity to 100 refugees who are students there.
- The ETC is meeting with agencies, such as International Organisation for Migration (IOM), UN Development Programme (UNDP) and UNFPA to determine how S4C can support existing Communicating with Communities (CwC) activities.

# **Planned Response**

- In line with the decision adopted by the UN Country Team (UNCT), the ETC is working to hand over the management of the Inter-Agency Communications Centre (COMCEN) in Erbil, Dohuk and Sulaymaniyah to the UN Department of Safety and Security (UNDSS). This is expected to be completed in the first week of April.
- The ETC is planning to conduct a telecommunications assessment missions Salahaddin and Anbar. S4C assessments in both locations will also be conducted.

# Challenges

• The security situation remains volatile across the country. Movements of humanitarian aid workers are heavily restricted.
