# **ETC Situation Report #56**

# Reporting period 20/11/2018 to 31/12/2018

These Situation Reports are distributed monthly. The next report will be issued on or around 30/01/19.

### **Highlights**

- The ETC will be phasing out of Iraq completely by 31 March 2019 and is therefore planning to transition all its services.
- The ETC conducted two missions to Domiz and Arbat camps to demobilize the Ericsson Response equipment.
- The ETC will stop providing Internet connectivity in all the hubs by 31 December 2018 as part of the ETC phase out and closure.

#### **Situation Overview**

Although 3.8 million Iraqis have returned to their homes since the start of the crisis, more than two million Iraqi people remain displaced and a total of 8.7 million are still in need.

Protection challenges continue to be the primary focus, particularly due to the presence of armed actors in camps across the country.

However, the ETC received US\$137,000 approved from the Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) 2019. The ETC will use all the funds received on the phase out and closure process up until 31 March 2019.



### Response

- The ETC conducted missions to both Domiz and Arbat camps to demobilise and uninstall Ericsson Response equipment to return it to the company's headquarters in Sweden. This equipment has previously been used by the ETC to provide Internet connectivity and security telecommunications services in both camps. However, these services were demobilized due to the existence of reliable local Internet Service Providers and mobile network operators.
- The ETC has programmed a total of 9 radios for the International Organisation for Migration (IOM) and UN Development Programme (UNDP) staff during the reporting period. Radio programming ensures humanitarian staff can access the security communications network in place and can communicate safely with colleagues, the Communications Centres (COMCEN) and receive security broadcast messages.
- As the ETC prepares to transition its services by the end of March 2019, the ETC is in the process of handing over the provision and services of security telecommunications to the UN Assistance Mission in Iraq (UNAMI) as the lead agency in Iraq.

### **Services for Communities (S4C)**

- The ETC team held a meeting with IOM to further discuss in detail the gaps and needs of IOM's ticketing system for the three Community Response Centres (CRCs) in West Mosul, East Mosul and Fallujah. CRCs will be used by affected communities to find out information about what assistance is available to them and attend awareness sessions and workshops about CV writing, job opportunities, English classes and web design.
- The ETC will complete the installation of equipment in these three CRCs before it phases out of Iraq at the end of March.

### **Challenges**

 The security situation remains volatile across the country. Movements of humanitarian aid workers are heavily restricted.

# **Meetings**
