## **Minutes**

### 1. Situation update

- Tropical Cyclone (TC) Lola formed out of a depression on 20 October and later turned into a category 5 cyclone by 24 October. Both domestic and international flights were rescheduled as TC Lola made landfall in Vanuatu on 24 October.
- It is estimated that the total population affected by the tropical cyclone is 60,000. The Vanuatu
  National Disaster Management Office (NDMO) has estimated that around 27,500 people are in
  need of assistance.
- There has been reports of significant damage to schools and healthcare facilities, no direct loss of life was reported, however, there were two deaths recorded from a landslide following the cyclone.
- Power and communications have been affected significantly. Currently, a state of emergency has not yet been declared.
- Many of the affected areas were still recovering from Cyclones Judy and Kevin which hit Vanuatu earlier this year in March. TC Lola has impacted the recovery efforts.
- Penama and Malampa provinces are the priority areas for the NDMO to respond.
- The networks of the two Mobile Network Operators—Vodafone and Digicel—were both down
  after the cyclone passed. They are currently restoring their services. Digicel has restored about
  90% of its services.
- There were reports of telecommunications towers being completely destroyed and most of the damage reported is on Pentecost.

### 2. Global ETC update

- The ETC in the Pacific is supporting the government-led rapid assessment teams with three satellite phones and six prepaid SIMs to provide connectivity for the initial damage assessment in the outer islands.
- Logistics partners are assisting the technicians to travel to the affected areas and begin assessments on VSAT sites.
- The Vanuatu Broadcasting and Television Corporation (VBTC) have FM repeaters in some of the areas with national radio. However, presently, most communication is taking place via Facebook.
- Starlink terminals set up and/or supported by the ETC in Provincial Emergency Operations
  Centres (PEOCs) during Cyclones Judy and Kevin earlier in 2023 are reported to be functional and
  are providing connectivity. Government responders in the PEOCs are using these devices to
  communicate with the NDMO on the mainland of Efate. There are five Starlink terminals deployed
  in PEOCs in Torba, Sanma, Penama, Malampa, and Tafea.

#### **CISCO**

#### **GSMA**

• Digicel is on track to restore its services while Vodafone is slightly behind this.

#### **IOM**

 Currently monitoring and collaborating with colleagues on the ground in Vanuatu. Also liaising with colleagues in Canberra, Australia, noting that are are busy with the field enumerators using the Kobo tool.

In reviewing the developments on the ground and the capacity of the National ETC to coordinate the restoration of connectivity services, no further Global ETC calls are necessary for the TC Lola response.
