800+ humanitarians in Maiduguri since February 2017 and a daily average of **50** humanitarians in Dikwa, **35** in Bama, **25** in Gwoza, **20** in Ngala and **15** in Monguno from **91** organisations have used ETS Internet services

Since its activation in November 2016, the ETS has been providing vital shared communications services to humanitarians in North-East Nigeria. These services enable a safer and more efficient response in areas with limited or unavailable services from local Mobile Network Operators (MNOs).
