638 handheld radios reprogrammed from **20** organisations



496 humanitarians from **43** organisations used Internet services provided by the ETS in Maiduguri



430 humanitarians from **17** organisations trained on radio standards procedures



60 registered devices from WFP, UNICEF and WHO using the Iridium Push-To-Talk coverage provided by the ETS in North-East Nigeria

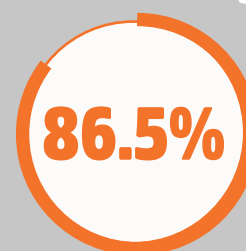
